A look back on life in L'Arche

Scotland became a second home to me back in 2011. I left Canada on a very cold stormy day in January and arrived in Glasgow to spring like weather. What a knock to the system to be driving on the wrong side of the road and to travel north by train through all those fields and mountains. The countryside was exactly as I imagined it would be, dotted with sheep and cows with mountains and streams in the distance. Although it was exactly what I expected it didn't prepare me for my first few days in L'Arche. I was picked up at the train station in Inverness and brought directly to the workshop where I was bombarded with hugs, smiles and questions from core members and assistants. There were so many people! Mark and Jackie accompanied me to my new home "Mactalla' Mark ensured that I was introduced to everyone. Next Kevin and Barbara welcomed me with more excitement and smiles. I've never been more made to feel at home. Soon it was supper time and everyone sat down at a long table. This was only the beginning of a year and a half of love, tears and learning.

Soon I adjusted to the daily and weekly schedule of the house and each core member. With 10 people in one house there was always something going on and someone to spend time with. Thankfully the 'Rota' or schedule was created each week with everyone's input. Our weekly house meetings we each got to request something if we wanted for groceries or suggest what should change in the house. And of course visitors all the time from the community friends and family. The kettle never stopped boiling! It never felt like work though. It felt like family. Yes there was paperwork and specific requirements like training but I felt like this sharing of life was more the goal. We shared meals, car rides, space on the couch, vacations, nightly prayer, work, and phone calls (I think my mom talked more to everyone else sometimes when I called). Friends would ask 'Do you ever get a day off?' Of course but that just meant I had time to sightsee.

Jackie taught me how tea can change your life. A good cup of tea makes everything better. Barbara taught me how important it is to sit back and listen. Kevin showed me how a simple hello can break through all the dreariness someone is feeling. Mark showed me how to really appreciate music as we would sing on our way to the pool. And finally, Hayley taught me that even though our personalities clashed there was still an appreciation and love for each other. Each of these lessons was learned slowly over time and a few I didn't realize had been learned until years later.

I've been back to Inverness twice since coming home to Canada. Never have I felt such a peace of mind as when I walk up the road knowing that I'm going home. As I continue my work supporting individuals with disabilities I try to keep in mind the lessons of L'Arche...It is more than a job, it is creating relationships and homes with people so that they know they have a place to belong.

Regular schedule


