The foundation received funding from government to support having the two students, known as the Cultural Ambassadors, perform and facilitate music programs for various audiences during the summer.

The L'Arche Avalon members enjoyed Maddy's wonderful singing, and appreciated sharing their valuable insights related to the meaning of the song in relation to the theme.

Jamie plays percussion and guitar which helped him fit in with L'Arche Avalon, as so many of our members enjoy the various drums. He attended the Jam Circle on July 25th and he entered into the Jam

Circle program and provided music that was appreciated by L'Arche Avalon members.

A token of our appreciation was presented to Maddy and Jamie, as well as an expression of our gratitude to Soundbone Traditional Arts Foundation for these timely and valuable resources.

#### **Annual General Meeting Of L'arche Avalon**

The community's AGM was held on August 23, 2020 at The Lantern on Barnes Road. Lewis Andrews, Chair of the Board welcomed those present and called the meeting to order. Peter Barnes did a short reflection using a butterfly as a symbol of transition and new life as he focused on the community's transition into the next phase: a residential community. Following that was the presentation of annual committee reports which detailed the activities and initiatives of the Board and the community over the past fourteen months. Lorraine Angelopoulos completed her duties as Chair of the Nomination Committee by announcing the three candidates who offered to serve on the new Board: Sheilah Mackinnon Drover, Peter Barnes and Jan Buley. Each candidate said a few words on why he/she wanted to serve, or continue to serve, on the Board. As there were no nominations from the floor, those candidates were elected by acclamation. Sheilah Mackinnon

Drover gave the closing remarks. She said that we are a small group with big plans and noted that at times we may be discouraged in our efforts to be a catalyst for change; but she asserted that with focus and hard work, we will stay the course. She reminded us that we are a team of ordinary people trying to achieve extraordinary results: homes that celebrate and support people with disabilities.

At the first meeting of the new Board on September 10, 2020, there was an election of table officers. The decision on the treasurer position has been deferred. In addition, Chairs of Standing Committees were decided and remaining board members affirmed their commitment to L'Arche Avalon.




to hold any of our fundraising events for the past 10 months. We are not all about money, but you know nothing happens without it. Please consider making a year-end donation today.








