Dear fellow board members and friends,

I hope this message finds you healthy, enjoying the end of summer, and happy! I have been thinking of our group often here in Bethlehem. I wear my T-shirt proudly to volunteer at l'Arche Ma'an lil Hayat and around town. Several people have asked about the project, about who we are, and about what we do. Of course, I have taken every possible opportunity to talk about us! It is only in coming here that I discovered Ma'an lil Hayat's project status. It made me think that volunteers might be recruited/found in a near future for l'Arche Avalon gatherings and activities.

I have taken quite some time to contemplate my next steps, and have chosen to resign from my job in St. John's. I have also decided to extend my volunteer experience here in Bethlehem another three months. My Arabic is progressing and I feel that there is so much for me to learn from the Palestinians with whom I share my life. For most people, life under military occupation is hard and very unpredictable. I am touched by the stories of core members and assistants at l'Arche who share some of their challenging experiences and situations with me. Among other things, sexual, physical and verbal abuse, severe social



isolation, loss and grief, poverty, challenging monogamous and polygamous family situations, unmet needs for assistance in daily activities such as bathing, and lack of access to basic services including healthcare are a part of daily life. L'Arche is a good place for people here. Trusting relationships between people with and without intellectual disabilities are possible, and joyful days are spent working felt (wool) together. I am

amazed by the resilience, generosity and creativity of people. Forward thinking can be challenging for some, but dealing with crises is a piece of cake. I am learning so much!

Although I am prolonging my stay in Bethlehem, I have decided to move closer to home upon my return to Canada. As you may have guessed, I am thus writing to resign from my position as a board member with L'Arche Avalon. It has been hard for me to come to this decision because



I love our group, our people and our goals so much. The past three years of involvement with Cornerstone Housing (first) and L'Arche Avalon have allowed me to feel a strong sense of belonging in Newfoundland and Labrador, and particularly St. John's. You are my Newfoundland family! I truly don't know how I could have managed without you. I

am so proud of the relationships that we have built, and the work that we have accomplished together over the years. I want L'Arche Avalon to succeed. People with and without intellectual disabilities alike need the place of belonging they have thanks to our walks, jam-circles, spiritual expressions gatherings, meals, and activities. L'Arche Avalon was a safe and joyful place for me. I cannot thank you all (and community members also!) enough for this gift.

I won't go on, for fear of sounding redundant. Please know that I trust in your vision for L'Arche in Newfoundland and look forward to visiting as soon as the opportunity arises. Please continue sending me the regular updates and newsletters. I love reading about you all!

Thank you for your support and understanding. We are united in L'Arche and in love despite the distance!
