

### Turf, Trust And Collaboration

On December 7, 2018, three members of L'Arche Avalon attended an interesting and informative interactive workshop hosted by the Community Sector Council. The workshop titled "Turf, Trust and Collaboration" focused on the core leadership competency of trust building. The session was very competently led by Liz Weaver of Tamarack Learning Services.

As we go about the process of community building in our L'Arche community, we are discovering the complexity of collaborating

with people of very different personalities and ideas. We are finding the relationship between trust and time. Trust takes time. We must first learn to trust ourselves and then to build relationships of trust within and without our community. Indeed, if we are to become a fully-fledged L'Arche community, we must learn to trust the L'Arche organizational model. We have to build trust with government and with the community at large. Trust takes time and a lot of very strategic, purposeful effort. Trust takes skill and personal commitment. Trust is the foundation of everything we want to build in our L'Arche community.

This workshop suggested trust-building activities, insights into our organizational culture, methods for deepening community, and strategies on how to work with friends, allies and enemies. Indeed, building trust is bigger than tactics – it is our entire mission.

# **Through Thick and Thin** by Helen Ries


It contains stories written by siblings of persons with intellectual disabilities, their experiences, their feelings, their worries and their copings, happy moments and more.
